Evaluation: January

To continue next year due to Covid 19. New planning format has been successful and additionally used to support teacher training for KS1 to support progression and transition between year groups. Purchase of equipment has been delayed due to covid-19.

To continue developing inter and intra sporting competitions. Delayed due to Covid 19

Fewer injuries at playtime. Smaller group games due to class bubbles. Playground leaders delayed due to Covid 19. To monitor and provide equipment for bubbles. Purchase and installation of outdoor equipment has been delayed due to covid-19.

Supported children and parents throughout the Covid 19 lockdown. Sign posted parents to participate in sporting activities. E.G. School sporting challenges (My Active Plan) and Joe Wicks daily fitness videos. Children enjoyed and took part in the competitions throughout the lockdown.

Sports day to be organised for Summer term. Bubble sports day to be organised if restrictions still in place.

No practical CPD has taken place at this point due to restrictions, same for any team teaching.

No school competitions have taken place at this point. Children have managed to take part in some virtual competitions where possible.

Playground leaders have not been started due to staggered break times. Also there have not been any clubs at this point so no coaches have come to school. Daily mile will start up when the staggered start times allow for it too. Some small playground equipment has been purchased and this has had to be distributed to each individual class for playtimes. There have been fewer incidents at playtimes due to smaller groups outside and more staff to monitor.

Forest Schools course taken and Forest School sessions being undertaken in school. However, with Covid bubbles, MS cannot take sessions with other groups.

Encouragement for more staff to take part in outdoor lessons has started.

Swimming has not yet restarted due to Covid restrictions and the local swimming pool that we use is only open for pupils attending that school.
