The week ahead...

What are we learning?

At Weston Infant Academy...

Nursery are:

- Blending and segmenting using words with the phoneme 'm'
- Singing the wheels on the bus Nursery Rhyme
- Looking at shapes on a bus e.g. circles and rectangles
- Washing vehicles, following routes with cars, counting passengers getting on and off the bus
- Thinking about what they can see on their way to school

Reception are:

- Blending and segmenting using the phonemes 'ur' and 'ai'
- Reading 'The Colour Monster' by Anna Llenas and describing the monster
- Looking at how to make numbers up to the value of 8 using part, part whole and tens frames
- Looking at sequencing events using time based vocabulary
- Learning about the jobs people do in our school and where our school is on a map

I1 are:

- Learning the phoneme 'are' as in care, 'y' as in funny and 'ph' as in photo
- Thinking about how the characters feel in 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'
- Looking at addition and subtraction subtracting one using number bonds and counting back using number lines to 20
- Continuing to learn about human and physical features in Geography
- Thinking about how to make a puppet in Design and Technology
- Labelling plants in Science

I2 and I3 are:

- Recapping the soft 'c' grapheme that makes a an 's' phoneme
- Re-writing a traditional tale by changing the story 'The Three Little Pigs'
- Using column addition working with larger values
- Learning about the major cities in the U.K.
- Thinking about where the Titanic went to pick up passengers
- Learning methods of travel in gymnastics

What are we learning?

World Book Day Activities:

- Nursery 'The Gingerbread Man' Role-playing the story and making links to food that we eat
- Reception 'The Three Little Pigs' Thinking about different jobs
- Year 1 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' Describing the emotions of the characters
- Year 2 'The Big Sad Wolf and the Mean Little Pigs' Thinking about alternative versions of the story

At Weston Junior Academy...

Year 3 are:

- Producing a piece of writing based on 'The Lost Thing' by Shaun Tan (Trust moderation writing)
- · Working with money counting in pounds and pence
- Focusing on a new Science topic Animals including humans
- Learning about the 'Eat well plate' and how we can use it to ensure that we are having a balanced diet

Year 4 are:

- Completing a written piece of work on 'The Inventing Room' using inverted commas and apostrophes for contractions
- Solving equivalent fractions
- Thinking about why Christians call the day that Jesus died 'Good Friday' and thinking about the Easter story

What are we learning?

Year 5 are:

- Continuing to read 'Kensuke's Kingdom and drafting and up-levelling their writing (a balanced argument focused on 'Is sailing around the world on a yacht worth the risk?')
- Exploring friction in Science its uses and problems and carrying out an experiment to see which materials increase friction
- Exploring Jewish communities in R.E.
- Practising different ways of passing a basketball in P.E.
- Looking at spreadsheets
- Learning Spanish vocabulary related to habitats

Year 6 are:

- Starting a new text 'Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone'
- Looking at perfect and progressive tenses and active and passive forms in Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPAG)
- Reading time analogue and digital
- Adding and subtracting time
- Learning to sing, 'You've got a Friend' by Carole King
- Looking at 'The Stuarts' in History
- Learning about cities and towns in Geography
- Looking at adaptation and evolution in Science

World Book Day Activities:

Year 3 - 'The Three Little Pigs' - Making freeze frames and using book creator to retell the story

Year 4 - 'The Gingerbread Man' - Making a flip book

Year 5 - 'St. George and the Dragon' - Stop animation using knights and plastic dragons

Year 6 - 'Hansel and Gretel' - Retelling the story by updating the setting or telling from an antagonist point of view
