What are we learning?

At Weston Infant Academy...

Nursery are:

- Learning the phoneme 'm'
- Singing the Nursery Rhyme, 'Here we go 'round the Mulberry Bush'
- Identifying numbers and carrying out sorting activities
- Looking at how to care for ourselves e.g. dressing, brushing teeth, hanging up clothes
- Having fun playing parachute games

Reception are:

- · Learning the phonemes 'ee' and 'ow'
- Taking part in a range of activities themed around the Nursery Rhyme, 'Humpty Dumpty'
- Making pairs and identifying odd ones out
- Learning which two different numbers when added together make 8.
- Making papier mache eggs, painting, and using small world play horses and the king's men.

l1 are

- Learning the phonemes 'au', 'air' and the prefix 'un' e.g. untie
- Retelling the story of 'The Stripy Horse'
- Carrying out addition and subtraction using numbers up to 20
- Looking at algorithms in computing
- Carrying out gymnastic movements in P.E.
- Visiting the Toy Museum at Cannock Chaase

I2 and I3 are:

- Recapping on the phoneme 'dge'
- Recapping on 'ew' (Cool Blue/U-Hoo) and 'ie' for Yellow I and Green Froggy (Monster Phonics)
- Finishing reading 'Samson's Titanic Adventure' and recounting the final part of the story.

What are we learning?

I2 and I3 continued:

- Carrying out addition and subtraction using numbers within 100
- Using abstract strategies for addition
- Using spreadsheets in computing
- Choreographing their own dances in P.E.
- Learning about the meals, clothes and cabins of the passengers on the Titanic

At Weston Junior Academy...

Year 3 are:

- Writing about George from 'George's Marvellous Medicine' using coordinating conjunctions
- Dividing a two-digit number by a one digit number
- Designing and creating Stone Age tools
- Visiting the mosque to support their learning in R.E.
- Sorting rocks by their type e.g. metamorphic, sedimentary, igneous.

Year 4 are:

- Continuing to read 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' and looking at how
 to write speech and using apostrophes for contractions
- Looking at unit fractions and comparing fractions
- Comparing forests
- Learning about switches for electricity
- Learning about spreadsheets

What are we learning?

Year 5 are:

- Beginning a new book called, 'Kensuke's Kingdom' and thinking about the skills of prediction, inference and comprehension
- Multiplying fractions and looking at fractions of amounts
- Learning about air resistance
- Developing speed and agility in P.E.
- Learning about the different types of Viking weaponry

Year 6 are:

- Focusing on comprehension using the text, 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe' and making comparisons between Aslan's sacrifice and Jesus' crucifixion
- Learning about adverbs and adverbial phrases, adjectives and expanded noun phrases
- Interpreting graphs and analysing data from bar charts
- Identifying U.K. cities from their physical features (mountains, rivers, compass points and maps)
- Beginning a new topic in History 'The Stuarts History'
- Focusing on Spanish vocabulary for weekends
