What are we learning?

At Weston Infant Academy...

Nursery are:

- Learning the phoneme 'ss'
- Drawing pictures of their family and labelling them
- Counting the jewels on the King's crown and matching numerals to the quantity
- Designing a crown and preparing for a Coronation party e.g. balloons, party games and looking at flag designs

Reception are:

- Being assessed on their phonic knowledge
- Writing facts about King Charles III
- Counting beyond 20 and making the values using numicon
- Performing parades in the outdoor area
- Making portraits of the King using items that we find outdoors
- Learning about past, present and future Monarchs
- Making crowns and tracing the King's silhouette

11 are:

- Learning the phonemes 'oa', 'oe', 'ow' and 'ou' and how they can all make the same sound
- Re-telling the story of 'Fergus the Seadog'
- Looking at capacity and how to measure volume in standard and non-standard units
- Learning about King Charles III and his Coronation What is it? Why is it happening?
 What do people do at a Coronation?
- Continuing to learn about windmills and axles
- Looking at the story of 'The Lost Sheep' in R.E.

12 and 13 are:

- Looking at how 'ey' makes an 'ee' phoneme and revising other GPCs that they have learned this year
- Using comprehension skills to answer questions and how to find information and work between 2 different sources
- Looking at multiplication and the commutative law e.g. 2x5 is the same as 5x2
- Learning about the Coronation of Kings Charles III and how this will be different than the last one and what comparisons we can make

What are we learning?

12 and 13 continued:

- Using technology to research facts about our King
- · Making a portrait of the new King using a variety of media
- Adding facts to the work that we have created

At Weston Junior Academy...

Year 3 are:

- Reading part 2 of 'The Enormous Crocodile' and focusing on prepositions
- Looking at fractions counting in tenths and identifying tenths
- Looking at which countries the Roman's invaded and finding them on a map
- Taking part in a range of Coronation activities

Year 4 are:

- Looking at a non-chronological report about a dragon linked to the text,
 'How to Train your Dragon
- Looking at tenths and hundredths as decimals
- Learning about the water cycle
- Looking at Anglo-Saxon village life their jobs and their roles
- · Learning how to carry out a backhand shot in tennis

What are we learning?

Year 5 are:

- Looking at Chapter 14 of 'Kensuke's Kingdom' and focusing on using description and detail in their sentences
- · Drafting an island description
- Looking at properties of 2D and 3D shapes
- Learning about reversible and irreversible changes in Science
- Making spreadsheets using the 'Numbers' app
- Focusing on bowling and batting in cricket

Year 6 are:

- Reading Chapters 5 and 6 of 'Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone'
- Focusing on calculations, fractions, shape and decimals
- Learning about rivers in Geography
- Carrying out optical illusion Art activities
