What are we learning?

At Weston Infant Academy...

Nursery are:

- Recapping on the use of alliteration and continuing to learn their phase 2 phonemes
- Reading 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and identifying the initial phonemes in the names of the story characters and writing them
- Making shape castles for their beanstalk pictures
- Planting beanstalks and watching them grow over time
- Exploring textures on the texture table

Reception are:

- Learning the phoneme 'oi'
- Writing sentences about the 'Jack and the Beanstalk' story
- Looking at the capacity of the Giant's breakfast bowl
- Counting patterns using numbers to 20
- Counting beans
- Using the aim and throw technique to throw beans out of the window
- Making model castles outdoors using a range of different media

I1 are:

- Having fun with real and nonsense words
- · Looking at phonemes 'aw' and 'wh'
- Ordering jumbled sentences and reading them using their phonic knowledge to make sure that they make sense
- Looking at equal groups and adding them together.
- Making arrays of numbers
- Starting to create a story project adding animated pictures and adding sound effects
- Looking at human and physical features in Geography
- Making pop art pictures in Art

I2 and I3 are:

- Looking at the phoneme 'wor'
- Focusing on comprehension and reading skills
- Answering worded problems in Maths
- Making our own obstacle courses in P.E.

What are we learning?

12 and 13 continued:

- Learning how to locate the continent of Africa and to think about how many countries there are within Africa
- Thinking about what the weather is like in Africa

At Weston Junior Academy...

Year 3 are:

- Reading the second part of 'The Enormous Crocodile' looking at comprehension and vocabulary
- Learning about fractions fractions of amounts e.g. 1/4 of 20 = 5
- Investigating the lengths of bones in Science
- · Learning about the role of the bats-person in cricket

Year 4 are:

- Using 'show not tell' to write about emotions in preparation for a piece of writing involving a chase scene
- Making a whole with tenths and comparing decimals
- · Learning how to carry out a volley in tennis
- Making an Anglo-Saxon brooch in History

What are we learning?

Year 5 are:

- Creating a setting based on 'Kensuke's Kingdom' in their writing
- Looking at Chapter 5 and focusing on comprehension
- Learning about coordinates
- Thinking about 2 quadrants and 4 quadrants
- Using a range of fielding techniques in cricket
- Learning about the timeline of the Ancient Islamic Empire
- Learning about conductors and insulators in Science
- Learning the irregular 'I do' verb and the negative 'I do not' in Spanish

Year 6 are:

- Reading Chapter 7 of Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone
- Writing non-chronological reports
- Learning about coordinates
- Focusing on relationships in RSE
- Looking at bones in Science
- Looking at Reformation in History
