## What are we learning?

### **At Weston Infant Academy...**

### **Nursery are:**

- Playing games with the Monster Phonics characters Miss Oh No's dance class
- Sequencing the story of 'The Secret Path' and using their book skills
- Following the maze using positional language
- Using and arranging 2D shapes to make a butterfly
- Recycling and sorting materials and painting with string
- Making daffodil collages and playdough hedgehogs

### **Reception are:**

- Learning the Tricky Witch trigraph 'ear'
- Creating book reviews of 'Percy the Park-keeper's One Spring Day'
- Comparing the story to the previous Nick Butterworth stories that we have read (One Snowy Night, After the Storm)
- Using positional language to identify where animals are (Hide and Seek)
- Blossom tree painting
- Looking at woodland animal habitats
- Making messy maps of the story setting

#### I1 are:

- Looking at the phonemes 'ie' (field), 'ea' (bread), 'ear' (beard)
- Retelling the story of 'The Lighthouse Keeper' using descriptive sentences
- Looking at doubles and sharing in Maths
- Looking at fractions halves of shapes
- Looking at races and team races in P.E.
- · Thinking about what the children can do now that they couldn't do previously
- Looking at plants over time in Science

#### 12 and 13 are:

- Looking at 'ar' in words such as war, warm
- Revisiting all of the features that we need to use to make an excellent sentence
- Adding more than two additions together
- Telling the time and reading scales

## What are we learning?

### I2 and I3 continued:

- Looking at races and team races in P.E.
- Planting sunflowers and learning what they need to thrive
- Learning about African animals what are they and what do they look like?

### At Weston Junior Academy...

#### Year 3 are:

- Looking at the features of a non-chronological report
- Finding equivalent fractions
- Finding out about the Roman army and the tactics that they used
- Making Roman catapults in Design and Technology
- Visiting the Monkey Forest

### Year 4 are:

- Using Show Not Tell to write about a tense chase scene from 'How to Train Your Dragon'
- Looking at money and the four mathematical operations
- Making an Anglo-Saxon brooch
- Desiging an Anglo-Saxon village complete with labels

## What are we learning?

#### Year 5 are:

- Reading Chapters 6 and 7 of 'Kensuke's Kingdom'
- Writing a dialogue and a short character description
- Looking at coordinates in a 2 and 4 quadrant grid
- Looking at electrical conductors and insulators and the properties of materials in Science
- Performing the 'Fresh Prince of Bel-Air' with recorders and percussion in Music

### Year 6 are:

- Reading Chapter 8 of Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone
- Focusing on comprehension
- Problem-solving using money and looking at percentage change
- Looking at the circulatory system in Science and carrying out an experiment linked to exercise and the heart
- Looking at Catholics and Protestants in the Stuarts period of History
