- Building a windmill using 'junk modelling' materials
- Re-enacting the story of 'The Little Red Hen' using story masks
- Sorting old and new farm machinery
- · Thinking about how we can be kind

- Looking at plurals and 'a-e' in phonics
- Sequencing the story 'If I had a Dragon' and predicting what will happen next
- Ordering objects and numbers and using a number line
- introducing parts and wholes
- Learning facts about Marcus Rashford
- Looking at continuous line drawings in Art and E-safety in Computing

### Year 3 are:

- Identifying counties that border Staffordshire in Geography
- Thinking about, 'Who was Josiah Wedgwood?'
- Making shadows in Science

- Learning a song using makaton in music

### Year 6 are:

- Creating a final draft of a newspaper article about treasonous Tumnus
- Reading Chapters 7 and 8 of 'Narnia' and answering comprehension questions
- Using apostrophes for possession and contraction
- Using commas for lists, for parenthesis, for subordinate and embedded clauses and in direct speech and compound sentences
- · Carrying out long division using double digit divisors
- Solving multi-step reasoning problems involving division
- Locating English counties in Geography
- Classifying vertebrates in Science
- Looking at charities inspired by Jesus' example
- Thinking about peer pressure in PSHE
- Focusing on American football and swimming in P.E.
