What are we learning?

At Weston Infant Academy...

Nursery are:

- Listening to the Black Cats' favourite things and listening for the instruments they can hear
- Identifying the sounds in the Ghosts' castle
- Completing a Robot Rob posting activity
- Reading the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'
- Feeding the caterpillar the days of the week and thinking about who the characters are and who feeds him first
- Making butterfly symmetry and caterpillar colour patterns ABAB. AABB
- Ordering number caterpillars and forming their own numbered ones
- Tasting fruit and practising their cutting skills

Reception are:

- Group 1 are learning yellow I 'igh' and Group 2 are learning Black Cats 'ur'
- Reading 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and writing a sentence about the picture in the story and developing their independence
- Building numbers beyond 10 and continuing patterns beyond 10
- Recapping 3D shapes and building castles
- Looking at the lifecycles of a bean
- Planting own beanstalk and thinking about what beans need to grow
- Building castles and ladders using different materials
- Threading harps and carrying out races in P.E.

Year 1 are

- Looking at 'Tiddalick' an Aborginal story
- Recapping all phase 5 phonemes
- Looking at adjectives and the conjunctions 'and' and 'because'
- Writing sentences to match a picture
- Locating Antartica and naming it's continent and oceans
- Designing and making baby bear's chair using tubes to build a structure

Year 2 are:

- Looking at 'Tiddalick' an Aborginal story
- Revision of 'il, el, al'
- Learning about expanded noun phrases
- Using a comma, sentence openers, conjunctions (mixed), retelling a story
- Thinking about mass, capacity, temperature in Maths

What are we learning?

Year 2 continued:

- Locating Antartica and discussing its location in relation to the poles and equator
- Naming its 5 states
- Designing and making baby bear's chair by making tubes

At Weston Junior Academy...

J1 are:

- Learning about and using prepositions
- Being introduced to fractions
- Developing their touch typing skills in Computing
- Learning how to play dodgeball in P.E.

J2 and J3 are:

- Reading 'How to Train Your Dragon' Chapter 1
- Focusing on comprehension
- Looking at fractions on a number-line and looking at equivalent fractions
- Making rainforest dioramas in Art

What are we learning?

Year 5 are:

- Learning about modal verbs
- Looking at figures of speech
- Reading 'Percy Jackson' Chapters 3 and 4
- Identifying angles
- Measuring angles
- Catching and thowing in cricket in P.E.
- Looking at gears, levers and pulleys in Science
- Looking at the location of the ancient Islamic Empire

Year 6 are:

- Reading Chapters 3 and 4 of 'Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone' and answering the questions
- Learning the definitions of radius, diameter and circumference and the relationship between the radius and diameter of a circle
- Writing a response to the Easter Story
