At Weston Infant Academy...

Nursery are:

- Reading the story of 'The Christmas Pine'
- · Writing and posting letters to Santa
- Tree cutting, balancing baubles and wrapping with Christmas ribbon
- Designing, decorating and writing our Christmas cards
- Looking at the 12 Little Elves book, measuring the lights and beads on the tree, counting baubles and making abab patterns
- Discussing family traditions during Christmas time and sharing how we feel when we receive a gift
- Christmas fairy light printing, making salt dough decorations, Christmas wreath painting, making elf craft bags
- Performing our Christmas performance to a live audience

Reception are:

- · Learning the tricky phoneme 'ar' and looking at high frequency words
- Reading the story of 'The Jolly Postman'
- Talking about our own experiences of Christmas and discussing what Christmas means to us
- Cutting Christmas trees, balancing baubles and wrapping Chistmas trees
- Writing letters to Santa and Christmas cards
- Looking at shapes with 4 sides, naming shapes and putting shapes within shapes
- Christmas fairy light printing, making decorations from salt-dough, making Christmas wreaths and snowman craft bags
- Performing our Christmas performance to a live audience

Year 1 are:

- · Carrying out phonics revis- e-e, a-e, i-e, o-e, u-e
- Writing letters to Santa using out phonemes/graphemesupport us to write a list/a sentence describing a gift we
 would like to receive
- Learning about 2D and 3D shapes and making patterns
- Naming the properties of 2D shapes
- Revision of place value greater than, less than
- Recognising and celebrating our own strengths and setting a goal for ourselves
- . Using compass directions to find places within the school e.g. the hall, the field, the library
- Recalling the main events of the Christmas story
- Performing our Christmas performance to a live audience

Year 2 are:

- Practising writing in response to phonic dictation and spelling words using phonemes.
- Writing sentences with capital letters and full-stops
- Writing questions using a question mark
- Subtracting and adding across 10 and then across 20
- Sequencing and retelling the events of the Christmas story and talking about why this is important to Christians.
- Performing our Christmas performance to a live audience



At Weston Junior Academy...

J1 and J2 are:

- Reading Chapter 6 of 'The Hodgeheg' in guided reading, answering comprehension questions and recapping the reading gems
- Looking at 'Mog's Christmas Calamity' with a spelling, punctuation and grammar focus by changing present tense verbs into past tense (regular and irregular)
- Identifying and using prepositions
- Spelling compound words using Emile
- Looking at sharing and grouping, multiplying by 3 and dividing by 3
- Learning the names of 5 more animals in Spanish
- Learning about a day in the life of a miner in History
- Reserching and taste testing jam tarts in Design and
- Performing our Christmas performance to a live audience

J3 and J4 are:

- · Learning about adverbials of time
- Looking at features of newspaper
- Multiplying by 10, 100, 1000
- Dividing by 10, 100, 1000
- Learning about Maya food in History
- Learning about the festival of Sanfermines in Spanish
- Performing our Christmas performance to a live audience

J5 and J6 are:

- Looking at coordinates in all 4 quadrants
- Creating winter poetry
- Making Christmas decorations using sewing e.g. gingerbread
- Thinking about respectful relationships
- Performing our Christmas performance to a live audience



ATTENDANCEMATTERS

Term time holidays

It is not a parental right to take their child on holiday during term time. Holidays in term time will not be authorised, unless there are exceptional circumstances and you have completed a holiday request form in advance. If you choose to take your child out of school for an unauthorised holiday you could receive a penalty notice of £80, per parent, per child.





The Law states (Education Act 1996, Section 7) that all children of compulsory school age must receive an appropriate full-time education. As a parent/carer, you are legally responsible for making sure your child recives an effective education. Failure to ensure your child attends school regularly could lead to intervention from the Missing Education & Child Enployment Service which has the power to implement:

Fixed Penalty Notices Prosecution An Education Supervision Order

Admissions Information for September 2026

Dear Parents and Carers.

You can now apply for Reception places at Weston Infant Academy for September 2026. Applications should be made by Thursday 15th January 2026.

You can also apply for Year 3 places at Weston Junior Academy for September 2026 and again applications should be made by Thursday 15th January.

Even if your child is in our current Nursery and our current year 2 class you still need to complete an application form for a Reception place. and/or a year 3 place. We have enough spaces for everyone but we have to follow the Local Authority's admissions process.

Applications for new Nursery places for September 2026 open on Monday 1st December and the closing date for new Nursery applications is Friday 27th February 2026.
